Market Update:

- High Yield Bonds returned -1.2%⁽⁸⁾ in October, bringing YTD performance to +4.7%. Risk asset performance weakened in October, driven by geopolitical tension in the Middle East and rising rates. High Yield Bonds were further impacted by slowing capital markets activity. Spreads continued to widen during the month, though spreads have tightened 25 basis points YTD while yields are up ~60 basis points.
- Loans performance of -0.02%⁽⁹⁾ in October was the first negative performance of the asset class since May of this year, bringing the YTD performance to +10.1%. The asset class outperformed most of its fixed income counterparts and remains on track for the strongest YTD performance since the Global Financial Crisis.

Dividend Update:

- KKC declared a distribution of A\$0.017 (0.69% of NTA) for the month. This is in line with the announced FY24 distribution estimate of A\$0.20. As of 31 October, ASX Unit Price of A\$2.09, this represents a yield of ~9.59%⁽²⁾.

Portfolio Update:

- European Direct Lending (EDL) had no new additions or realizations over the month. EDL represents ~44% of KKC's portfolio invested across 40 assets as at month end.
- A case study on one of our EDL deals can be found on page 3.
- The weighted average price of the underlying KKC assets in the portfolio stood at 92.2% of par as at month end. The Yield to Maturity, which is inversely related to prices, stood at 12.2% and the current yield of the underlying assets in the portfolio was 10.3%⁽³⁾.

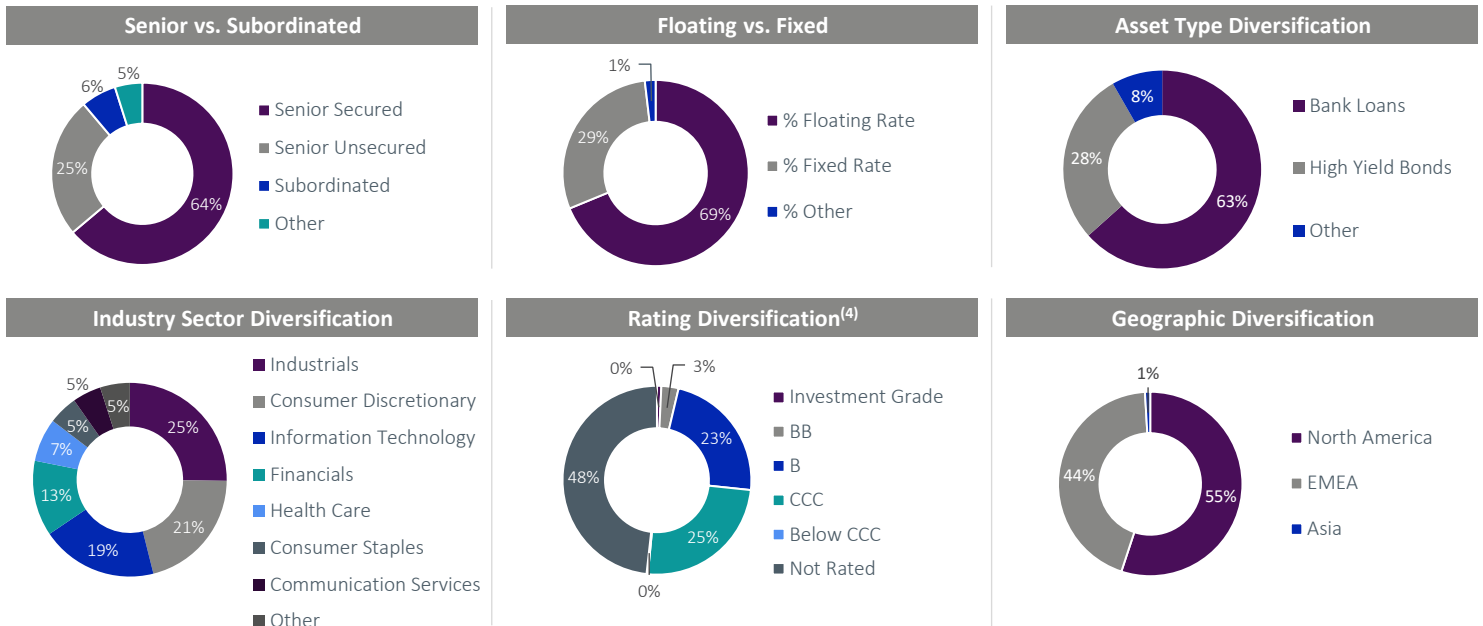

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Portfolio Case Study

Company Overview

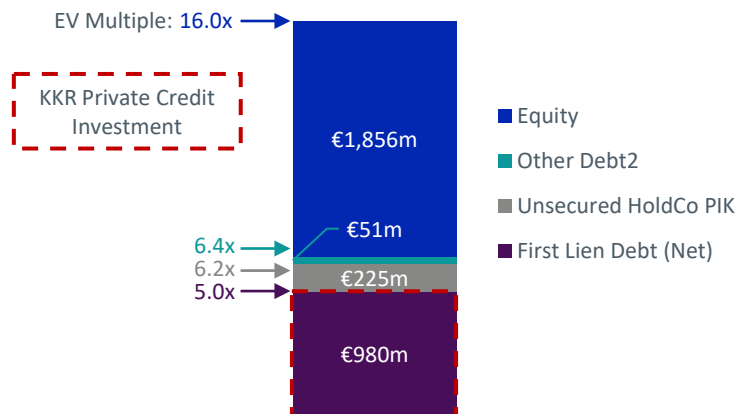
- Corden Pharma ("CP") is a Germany-based pharmaceutical CDMO (Contract Development and Manufacturing Organization) with eight manufacturing sites and one lab across Europe and the US. CP has strong end-to-end capabilities across the pharma value chain from API (Active Pharmaceutical Ingredient) production to drug formulation, fill-and-finish and packaging.
- CP operates through five distinct technology platforms diversifying its business across therapeutic areas and drug classes. It is also able to support drug production from early clinical phases all the way through to large-scale commercial supply. CP has a diversified customer base of biotech, big pharma and generics pharma companies.

Transaction Overview

- KKR Credit was approached by the sponsor, Astorg, as one of a handful of lenders to provide financing in support of their acquisition of CP from International Chemical Investors Group for an Enterprise Value of €3.1 billion (~16.0x Structuring EBITDA). The €1.4 billion financing package marked one of the largest privately placed transactions in the European market in recent years. KKR Credit participated ~€160 million across the facilities.
- Our investment thesis was predicated on CP's market-leading positions in its core technology platforms with a highly diversified customer and drug portfolio. CP's business model provides for significant forward revenue visibility. CP also operates in an attractive underlying market with growth supported by a continued outsourcing trend for pharma manufacturing.
- The deal team was able to leverage the broader KKR network for due diligence given our strong prior experience in the pharmaceutical industry across KKR Credit, Private Equity and Healthcare Growth teams.

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KKR Credit Income Fund (ASX:KKC)

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KKC Overview

The Trust aims to provide investors with attractive, risk-adjusted returns and access to a diversified portfolio of income generating alternative credit investments through the Trust's investment across strategies managed by the credit investment teams of Kohlberg Kravis Roberts & Co. L.P. ("KKR").

These strategies comprise the Global Opportunistic Credit strategy and European Direct Lending strategy, which seek to take advantage of the attractive opportunities that KKR sees in the market. The Trust's investment objective is to provide an income stream as well as to achieve attractive long-term capital appreciation over a full market cycle.

KKC has announced that for the financial year ending June 2024, KKC is targeting a distribution of +8.6% based on the issue NTA per unit of A\$2.3308⁽²⁾ (20.0c per year). The Trust continues to target a medium-term average total return of 6% - 8% per annum⁽⁵⁾ through the market cycle.

The Trust is appropriate for investors seeking income distribution to be used as a satellite allocation within a portfolio where the investor has a 5+ year investment timeframe and a medium to high risk/return profile.
