Portfolio Update:

- KKC delivered a +0.20% return in January. High Yield bonds outperformed Loans over the month and B and CCC rated assets drove performance across asset classes.
- The weighted average price of the underlying KKC assets in the portfolio stood at 98.0% of par as at month end. The Yield to Maturity, which is inversely related to prices, stood at 9.5% and the current yield of the underlying assets in the portfolio was 8.5%⁽³⁾.
- European Direct Lending (EDL) had no new additions during the month. There was two realizations, a UK Human Resource & Employment Services provider and a UK Veterinary Pharmaceutical company. EDL represents ~42% of KKC's portfolio invested as at month end. A case study on one of our EDL deals can be found on page 3.

Distribution Update:

- KKC declared a distribution of A\$0.0167 (8.13% of NTA) for the month. This is in line with the announced FY25 distribution estimate of A\$0.20. The distribution guidance for the year ending 30 June 2025 will keep the monthly distribution target unchanged at A\$0.0167 per unit per month, or A\$0.20 per annum. As of 31 January, ASX Unit Price is A\$2.34, this represents a yield of ~8.55%⁽²⁾.

Market Update:

- High Yield bonds returned +1.38%⁽⁸⁾ in January as the asset class benefited from a rebound in equities, below average issuance, a resumption of retail inflows, and positive macro signals. Loans provided a 15th consecutive month of gains in January (+0.69%)⁽⁹⁾ amid a Fed pause, accelerating inflows, and a record pace of repricing activity.

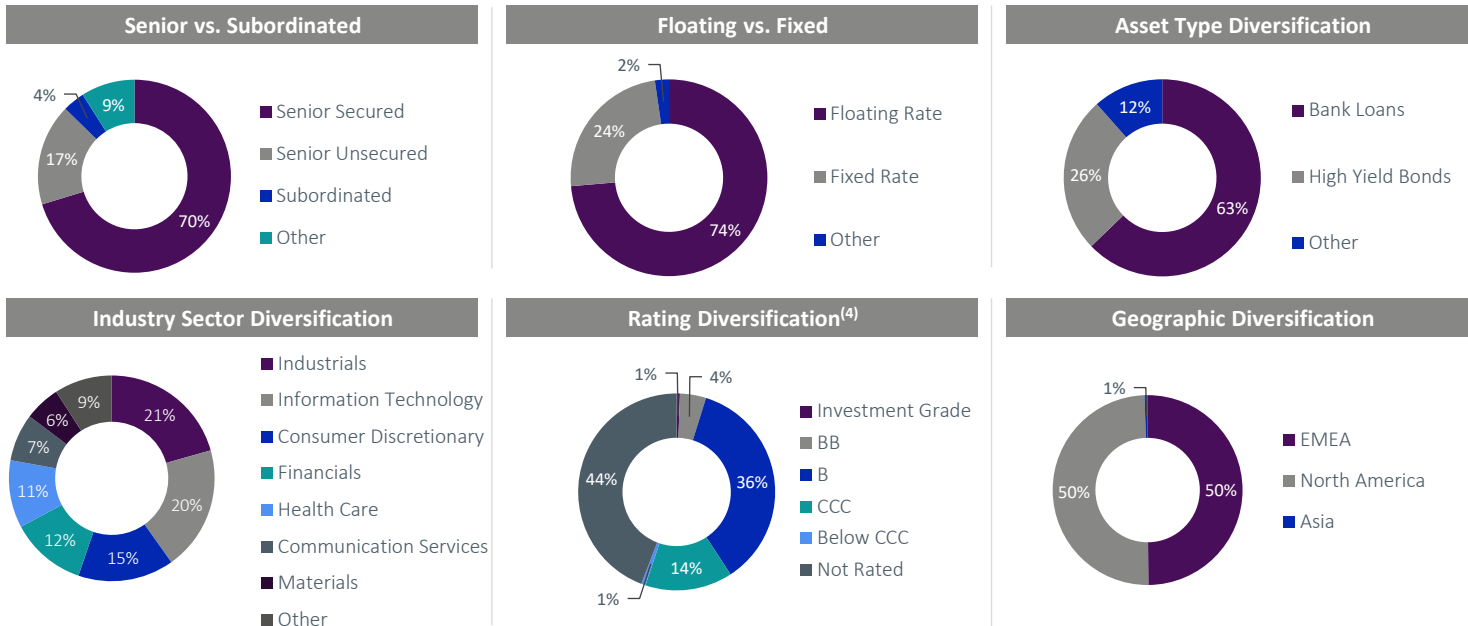

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Portfolio Case Study

Company Overview

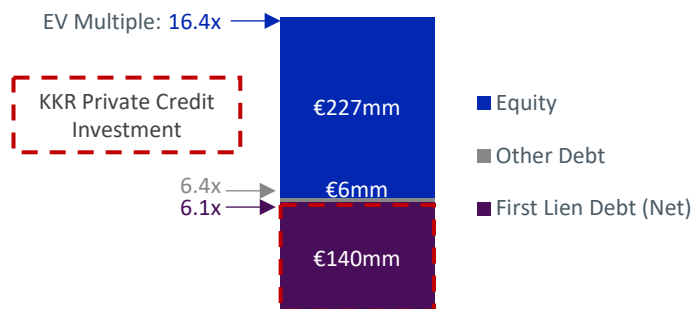
- Founded in 2000, F24 Holding ("F24") is the leading provider of Emergency Notification and Crisis Management ("ENS/CM") software in Europe. The Company serves ~5,200 customers, primarily comprised of large corporate and public sector entities in Western European countries.
- F24's core ENS/CM offering is a software platform enabling omni-channel employee communication and executing crisis management and business continuity plans in emergency situations (e.g. natural disasters or threats). 90% of the Company's revenue is recurring comprised of software subscriptions and volume-based charges for sending out alerts (e.g. via SMS, voice, e-messaging).

Transaction Overview

- Altor acquired F24 from Hg Capital in October 2024 for an EV of €373 million (c. 16x RR Cash EBITDA). The acquisition was financed with a €140 million Unitranche facility, an additional €50 million Delayed Draw Term Loan ("DDTL") to support future M&A and ~€230 million of equity. KKR Credit committed 25%, or ~€48 million across the credit facilities.
- Our investment thesis is based on: (i) attractive growth in the European ENS/CM market at ~8% p.a., historically, driven by growing software penetration and regulatory tailwinds; (ii) F24's market-leading position (~17% in Europe with strong leadership in the DACH and Nordics regions); (iii) significant revenue visibility with ~90% contracted recurring sales (60% subscription and 30% volume-based, 3 year avg. contract length) and strong retention metrics of ~94% GRR / ~106% NRR with ~4% churn; (iv) a highly diversified customer base with ~5,200 logos and a low average cost to customers relative to the size of their IT and security spend; and (v) strong historical financial performance with ~12% organic topline / 27% Cash EBITDA growth over 2021-2024 with growing margins.

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KKC Overview

The Trust aims to provide investors with attractive, risk-adjusted returns and access to a diversified portfolio of income generating alternative credit investments through the Trust's investment across strategies managed by the credit investment teams of Kohlberg Kravis Roberts & Co. L.P. ("KKR").

These strategies comprise the Global Opportunistic Credit strategy and European Direct Lending strategy, which seek to take advantage of the attractive opportunities that KKR sees in the market. The Trust's investment objective is to provide an income stream as well as to achieve attractive long-term capital appreciation over a full market cycle.

KKC has announced that for the financial year ending June 2025, KKC is targeting a distribution of +8.6% based on the issue NTA per unit of A\$2.3308⁽²⁾ (20.0c per year). The Trust continues to target a medium-term average total return of 6% - 8% per annum⁽⁵⁾ through the market cycle.

The Trust is appropriate for investors seeking income distribution to be used as a satellite allocation within a portfolio where the investor has a 5+ year investment timeframe and a medium to high risk/return profile.
